The Watchful Wife is the story of Ellen Wells, a sheltered young woman brought up in the austere Free Church of Kirkton, where women are required to serve, dress soberly and never draw attention to themselves. There is a life of few pleasures and little freedom.

Managing to make her escape, Ellen becomes a teacher at a girls' high school where, despite a rocky start, she gradually finds her place. No one is more surprised than she is when Gordon, a fellow teacher, shows interest in her and they fall in love.

When Gordon is promoted to head of English at a prestigious private school, Ellen is both proud and delighted. Life is beautiful and for a time nothing can diminish their happiness. Everything unravels, however, when Gordon is accused of a crime he swears he didn't commit. Ellen believes him; of course she does. And even as the evidence against him mounts, still her faith in him stays strong.

Gripping and intriguing, *The Watchful Wife* draws the reader into a world swirling with suspicion and accusations where nothing is quite as it seems and not everyone can be trusted.

Talking points include:

- This is Suzanne's second book set in a school. What is it about this setting that appeals to readers?
- Suzanne is the daughter of a theologian. What else inspired her to include a storyline about religion?
- Suzanne's work as a lawyer inspires her writing. What is the nature of truth and how it is revealed or hidden in the courtroom? What is the effect of the criminal justice system on the families of those who find themselves embroiled in it?
- Suzanne is interested in the lives of children who are ostracised and how they make their way through a society that can be hostile to them. How is it that some damaged children are lost, and others manage to navigate life more successfully?
